PROTECT OUR MIGRATING BIRDS IN TEXAS

- Turn off non-essential lights inside and outside
- Turn off landscaping lights in trees
- If you need to prioritize, turn off lights during <u>peak</u> <u>migration</u>. Check bit.ly/Lights_Out_Texas for dates
- For essential lighting
 - Use dark sky friendly light fixtures or shields
 - Set timer or motion sensors

Simple Ways to Support Spring Bird Migration

- Plant some favorite foliage. Migrators are not only wonderful harbingers of spring, but also great helpers with insect control and pollination
- Leave the leaves and the dead flowers
- Turn your lights out!
- Reduce reflectivity and make your windows opaque
- Protect birdhouses and feeders from predators
- Offer specific seed types
- Add a variety of feeders and birdhouses


